We hosted three interns from GSU-School of Social Work to working on their BSW and one working on their MSW.





Consumers Served








Consumers Served

Success Story #1

A young adult had been having difficulty getting supports in order to do things in the community. He had applied for waiver services and attempted to obtain the services for a long time. The consumer began working with an IL Specialist. Through advocacy and peer support, the consumer was able to obtain the waiver services. Once he received the services, he was able to use the supports to go to school. He has been able to attend and recently, he received the highest grade in the class on a paper, and wrote an article for the school newspaper on Inclusive Post- Secondary Education. He reports all of this couldn't have been done without the support he received.

Success Story #2

One consumer has expressed her excitement and appreciation to disability LINK as she had her home modifications completed during the month of July. She had been placed on the waitlist a few years ago when she first started having trouble getting in/out of her shower as well as trouble getting up/down from her toilet. What started as discomfort and minor struggles to do daily hygiene task turned into a constant bout with pain. She turned to disABILITY LINK who helped her to navigate through the entire process while giving her encouragement not to lose hope. She learned different aspects through peer support, advocacy, and IL skills training on ADA compliance, how to fill out applications, advocating for herself with construction workers and other agencies. She stated that she was happy with her new bathroom design and is most of all happy she "can finally use it."
