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FY 2020 Accomplishments

We host peer support groups focused on disability, intersectionality and diversity including "Just Us Blind Girls", "Us Protecting Us", and LGBTQIAP++disability

We held our first Days of Advocacy-"Our Voices, Our Vote" leadership and advocacy training to take to different legislative days.

Hosted an in-person and virtual job fair for people with disabilities. Over 20 employers were present and several individuals offered jobs on the spot

We developed a Parent support group due to a collaboration between disABILITY LINK, Georgia Parent Support Network (CPT4Families), and Georgia State University Intern's project.

We were able to provide successful and substantial home modifications to 3 people and assistance with increased access in the home and community to over 35 people

We are a field site for social work, OT, and Education students with a primary selection of students interning are people with disabilities. This year we hosted 4 students

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
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


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




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
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




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
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




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Success Story #1

A consumer came to the center looking for assistance with employment, specifically, the consumer wanted a vocation that could not just utilize their specific skillset but, provide 100% of the accommodations that would be required in order for him/her to succeed within the workforce. The consumer was provided with a number of resources that are available in house (Leaps, PC training, assistive technology) as well as those within the community and online. One worth mentioning that the consumer noted as extremely useful to them was, JAN (The Job Accommodation Network). The consumer reports that he/she is gainfully employed, is happy to be a contributing member within society and is now able to provide for their family.

Success Story #2

A consumer reached out because they were facing being homeless due to COVID-19 and the loss of household jobs. Working with the ILS on immediate impacts of obtaining rental assistance, the individual was able to pay their rent for two months. The individual reports being relieved, but will continue to work on goals to look at options in regards to housing.

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Success Story #3

disABILITY LINK provided supports to a consumer that was in the nursing home for a year. The consumer had several diagnosis and disabilities which forced them into the nursing home. Prior to going into the nursing home the consumer was homeless and had no supports in the community. Through the support of the ILS the consumer was able to move back into the community with supports including a mobile doctor to come to their home.

The consumer reports that with the support system in place, they have been doing extremely well. The consumer reports being able to meet with their mental health provider and mobile doctor regularly. Meeting with their doctor regularly helps the consumer to be monitor with taking their medication and getting medical care they need to stay healthy in the community and out of the nursing home.

The Consumer reports feeling very positive about life and looking to move forward with starting a support group for individuals that has mental health.
